

Student Course Evaluations (SCE)



- Students will receive emails to complete course evaluations during the last two weeks of class.
- Students will access the course evaluations via Blackboard and myUMBC home page.
- Evaluations are only offered on-line, no paper forms.
- Instructors who have offered time in class to complete the evaluations have had higher response rates than those who do not.

WUMBC

- Quantitative SCE results will be compiled and published on the IRAD's website. A link to IRAD's website will be available in your faculty SCE email.
- Results of the open-ended Direct Instructor Feedback Forms (DIFF's) will be available only to the instructor teaching the class.
- All quantitative and DIFF reports will be available *after* the Registrar's Office posts all UMBC final grades.
- Faculty are encouraged to download a copy of their DIFF's for their records.
- > DIFF's results are only available until the following semester and are permanently deleted. DIFF's are not archived.
- SCE's are used as part of the Promotion and Tenure process.
- A direct link to your response rate is in the email.
- Submit all inquiries through the RT ticket system.
- We will send you an email with a link to view current response rates of your class(s) during the last two weeks of class.

Instructor Reports

- Once all UMBC grades have been posted by the Registrar's Office you will receive an email with instructions to access your evaluations reports.
- Results from the SCE are compiled in two ways:
 - Student Course Evaluation Instructor Report
 - Is quantitative (mostly utilizing a Likert scale).
 - Is public Information and published in the IRAD's website (https://irads.umbc.edu/university-data/sceq-profiles/).
 - Direct Instructor Feedback Form (DIFF)
 - Only viewable by instructor.
 - Six open-ended questions and comments section.
 - Faculty are highly encouraged to download a copy of their DIFF's for their records.
 - Your window to access DIFF results will end by the following semester's results. After that they are permanently deleted. DIFF's are never archived.
